Scotland's Finest Woods Awards

Our judges once again had their work cut out for them with a range of extremely good applications in the Schools and Early years catergories of the 2023 Scotlands Finest Woods Awards. In the end Fordyce Primary School in Aberdeenshire won the Crown Estate Scotland Schools Trophy and the Scotlish Forestry Early Years Trophy was won by Bushcraft Bairns, based at Comrie Croft.



The judges were impressed with the tireless work of pupils and staff at Fordyce Primary as they were involved with various projects such as the Fordyce Plantation project and planting a woodland in the school grounds as part of the Queens Green Canopy Project. The judges commented "what shone out was the pupils' voice in driving the school improvement journey and their investment and enthusiasm for the projects".



The judges were immediately captivated on arrival at Bushcraft Bairns as staff have created a fantastic forest school setting that nurtures connection with nature through play commenting that "a magical woodland space for young people to grow and learn about trees and woodlands" was evident for the visit to this wonderful site.

Banchory Academy, Oakbank Primary and Linnvale Primary School were highly commended by the judges for the fantastic effort by staff and pupils to foster a greater connection to woodlands and enhance learning opportunities through this work.

Congratulations to all winners and highly commended schools. Thank you to everyone that entered as all applications were of a very high standard and it's wonderful to hear about the great work taking place around the country. Hayward Review

The Hayward review which was considering the future of qualifications and assessment in Scotland has now been published.

Key recommendations of the Hayward report include:

- Adopting the SDA (Scottish Diploma of Achievement) as a graduation certificate for all senior phase educational settings
- The end of exams in S4 and a wider range of assessment methods used in Highers and Advanced Highers
- A digital profile for all learners which allows them to record personal achievements, identify and plan future learning.

John Muir Award Redesign Plans


